



67 students who have decided to enroll at 4-year universities. Here is a brief list of some of the universities that MBHS seniors will attend next year: San Diego State, San Francisco State, Long Beach State, Sonoma State, Cal Berkeley, UCLA, Northeastern, Gonzaga, University of Michigan, University of Alabama, Montana State University, Arizona State University, California Lutheran University, Oregon State University, Pacific University, UC

Santa Cruz, UC Santa Barbara, Saint Mary's College, Azusa Pacific University and, of course, Cal Poly SLO.

11 of our students intend to play sports at the collegiate level, including 5 at the Division 1 level.

1 of our students has made the courageous decision to serve our country in the United States Army.

158 out of 228 students in the class of 2022 have completed at least one CTE (Career Technical Education) pathway, in one of our 14 different focus areas. 60 students have completed 2 pathways. 18 have completed 3 path-

Message From Principal Arrigoni

Aving started as the principal of Coast Union High School in January, I have not had much time with the graduating class; but in the short time I have known them I am amazed by their character and accomplishments. The class of 2022 has persevered through almost two years of distance learning due to school closures from COVID. I am proud that the class of 2022 was able to spend their final year at CUHS on campus and were able to have a traditional senior year experience.

The class of 2022 has 46 graduating seniors and all have made amazing accomplishments in a variety of ways including academics, FFA, sports, mock trial, cyber security and career technical education (CTE). Eighteen students will attend four year colleges or

universities after graduation including: Cal Poly, Cal State-Fullerton, Cal State-Sonoma, Cal State-Stanislaus, Cal State-Chico, UC Davis, UC Berkeley, UC Santa Cruz and Azusa Pacific. Twenty-eight seniors plan on attending community college. Due to the generosity of the Cambria community and civic organizations, our graduates received \$131,000 in community scholarships. Coast students have also received the following county scholarships: Yeager Science Award \$23,000, Northern California Scholarship Foundation Award \$32,000, Kristin Smart Award \$4,500, and Richard Weyrich Leadership Award \$4,500.

I am so proud of them and am honored to be their principal. I wish you the best in your future and you will always be a Bronco.






